A big drop in numbers – nearly 400 lots less than last week in total, but most noticeable was the sudden drop in numbers of Old Season Lambs which seem to be drying up fast.

A few more New Season Lambs forward, and, if conditions stay dry and sunny, it seems likely they will come forward faster than expected. Best quality New Lambs up to 300p/kg on 3 occasions shared between Andrew Bennett and Mike Wilshaw, both with their first lambs of the year, and several pens making in excess of 270p/kg. Lambs with tight skins and plenty of “bloom” were all eagerly bid for, but those lambs that looked a bit stale, or which were considered not quite ready, met limited trade, mostly 220 – 240 p/kg.

A real mixed bag amongst the Old Season Lambs, as many regular vendors come to the end, and today’s entry included plenty of lambs which could be considered amongst the “misfit” category. Again anything with the right level of finish sold well, with Roger and Simon Bailey finishing the season well with pens to 256p, 252p, 251p etc and all meaty, well finished sorts over 200p.

Plenty falling into the “others” category, however, making between 130p/kg and 170p/kg.

A decent show in terms of numbers, quality once again very mixed. Some wonderful results for the right goods but those 'out of spec' cattle are the first casualties of a falling trade.

Out of the 18 steers, decent prime cattle were a good level trade. Generally in the high 40's and early 50's with 5 cattle grossing over £1000 and peaking at £1107.60 for Messrs Bickerton.

A splendid entry of heifers (34) selling on another strong trade. No less than 7 past 170p to a top of 202p for a superstar from Reg Beard. The top 5 heifers averaged 191.6p/kg.

Almost 40 Bulls and probably the worst hit on the day. Anything with meat sold respectably enough with 13 prime bulls averaging 142.23p but sluggish meat sales enabled buyers to be selective and the commercial sorts were harder work as a result.
