A similar entry this week comprising mostly hay and haylage with both barley and wheat straw in short supply. The hay trade was strong reflecting the continuing wintry weather conditions. Two loads of first quality small bale hay made £158 and £168 per tonne. The best of the big bale hay made £80 to £90 per tonne, but top price was for some very dry wrapped haylage at £92. Other decent quality hay made £60 to £70 per tonne and decent haylage £40 to £60 per tonne.

Big bale barely straw made £74 to £86 per tonne, averaging over £80. Only three loads of wheat straw on offer, two at £68 per tonne and one at £66. Surprisingly, the single load of fodder beet failed to attract interest despite a load from the same vendor making £34 per tonne last week.

Trade nationally has dipped a bit this week, but with nearly 200 lambs less forward than last week, several buyers were keen enough to fulfil orders to keep price levels close to those achieved a week ago.

Once again, a wide range in quality forward and the dip in demand was most noticeable for the Premium quality, as several Butchers report slower sales, as many housewives now see a leg of lamb as a bit of a luxury – after all, a decent sized leg is now costing well over £40 !

17 pens, however, still made in excess of 200p, and the continued rivalry for “TOP SPOT” continues, with the Bailey’s just beating Martin Shaw this week – and the very best lambs all making well over £100.

Over 1/3rd of the entry weighted in excess of 48kg, which does reduce the potential customer base considerably – but, remember, the overall average includes everything !
