Surprisingly large numbers of both New and Old Lambs – New ones have obviously finished quicker than expected, and there are more Old ones left than perhaps thought.

In any case, our regular buyers sprung into action and provided strong, competitive trade throughout.

Amongst the New Lambs top quality consignments from Andrew Bennett and Clair Tomlinson were rewarded with joint top price of 298p/kg, with most of their lambs making in excess of 280p/kg. and the top lambs per head making over £120, with 36 pens averaging over £104 per head. What a difference from a couple of years ago !

Very few quality Old Season lambs left with most vendors down to the last few. Those who have held them back in the hope of finishing them on fresh growth are being well rewarded, however, with many making in excess of £80, although today's top of £99.05, just short of the £100 barrier. Anything with a decent level of finish and conformation made above 180p/kg to 195p/kg for Messrs. Lord's lightweights.
